00/01 “Deepfakes and The Threat to Global Security”

The United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs (UNODA):

Guided by the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations,

Acknowledging the sociopolitical, economical and technological situation of the different Nations around the world,

Taking into account the Recommendations on the Ethics of Artificial Intelligence approved by the UNESCO,

Recognizing the pressing importance of developing effective regulation regarding the use of AI in warfare with the aim of assuring that human rights are not endangered,

Emphasizing the UN ought to be in charge of promoting and moving forward many technological aspects in regards to the ethical and legal use of AI alongside many new technologies alike,

Referring to the already existing AI European Act and its principles as a role model for a UN-led legal framework on AI regulation,

1. **Strongly recommends** the UN General Assembly to establish a UN mediated neutral body, the International Deepfake Monitoring Authority (IDMA) that focuses on overseeing deepfake technology and developments and performing investigation across borders,
 - a. the committee suggest the newly formed body to be organized under UNODA
